
Host a Love Always Everywhere

Valentine's Day Event!



BEFORE STARTING THE STORY: Hold up the book to show your audience the cover and tell everyone you are going to read a book about love to celebrate Valentine's Day. Ask if anyone in the audience can tell you what Valentine's Day is. Engage the children by asking who they love. Say things like "Raise your hand if you love your pets. Raise your hand if you love your siblings. Raise your hand if you love your friends." Then explain that the book you

> are about to read, Love, Always Everywhere, celebrates many kinds of love and ways you can show people that you love them.

> AS YOU READ: Ask the children questions about what they see in the book's illustrations. For example, in the playground scene where the girl loses her stuffed animal, you can ask your audience why she looks sad. Ask the children if they can point out the ways in which the characters are showing their love for one another.


